William and Louisa Ferguson filed claim in 1873 for wartime damage. She was then 69 and living near Accotink. From 1861 to 1867 she rented a farm 5 miles from Alexandria on the Mount Vernon Road from Mrs. Moore. Worked at the market in Alexandria; also worked at the Union hospital at Col. Kemper's place doing laundry. Is married. Her father was Gen. Washington's carpenter. After being emancipated, he purchased her mother before Louisa was born. Her husband was a slave of Dennis Johnston.
