This deed made & entered into this 24th
Deliver to day of December 1870, between Preacher Caufield
Rev J. H. Good ayd Harriet his wife of the first part & Horace
Lyon Frank Chambers, Wm W. Rhodes, Saml
Shippen & Luke Carter as trustees of the Methodist
E. Church of the Washington Conference, of the
second part, all of Suffolk County Virginia,
Westerseth, Right for and in consideration of
the sum of Thirty seven dollars in hand paid
the said parties of the first part do grant

with general warranty unto the said parties of the
 second part as Trustees aforesaid, a certain Lot
 of land lying & situated in said County of Yarmouth
 & near the village of Yarmouth Court House, Vt.
 it being a portion of the farm on which the said Canfield
 now resides & more particularly described as follows,
 to wit: Beginning at the northern corner of the
 Memorial Association Lot & running with the same
 east 75 ft. then south 144 feet, then westerly 75 ft.
 then northerly along the association Lot 144 feet
 to the beginning. But trust nevertheless for the
 use and benefit of the Methodist C. Church colored
 & for the purpose of erecting thereon a House of Public
 Worship for the use and benefit of the Ministers
 & Congregation of said Church or those who may
 from time to time be appointed by the powers authorized
 for such purpose to officiate & worship therein, but it
 is expressly covenanted & agreed by the parties of the second
 part, the said Trustees or their successors in Office,
 said building thereon erected, shall at no time be
 used as a School House - but only for the legitimate
 use for which it is hereby deeded, a house of public
 worship & the benefit of said congregation. It is
 further covenanted & agreed by the said Trustees &
 their successors in Office that should at any time
 the said Lot & buildings erected thereon cease to be
 used as a House of Public Worship or pass beyond
 the control of said Trustees or their successors in
 Office, that they and in that event the said Lot
 of ground with the appurtenances thereon shall revert
 to the said Preacher Canfield his heirs or assigns.

And it is further covenant by the parties of the
 first part, that they have the right to convey said
 property, that they have done no act to encumber the
 same, & will execute all such other deeds, for the more
 sure & effectual conveyance of the same. Where the
