The said Hannah was and is called Hannah Washington and was recognized by the said Lloyd Washington as his wife. He provided for her even during her temporary absence at her mother's home in Alexandria and he recognized the said Harriet A. as his daughter. The said Hannah claims that ~~she~~ she should be allowed to participate in the distribution as the decedent's widow and the said Harriet A. claims that she should be allowed to participate therein as his heir at law.

Complainant is informed that the said Lloyd Washington by a woman named Sarah had two illegitimate children, namely, Sarah E. ~~Washington~~ and Martha, the latter being under twenty one years of age. These parties are called Washington, but they are not claiming to be legally entitled to participate in the distribution of the said personal estate. What they ^{may} receive is due to the kindness and generosity of the said widow and heir at law.

In consideration of the premises complainant prays that he may be authorized and directed to distribute said personal estate to the said widow Hannah Washington and the said heir at law Harriet A. Hopkins or to such other person or persons as may be held lawfully entitled to receive it; that all decrees necessary for his protection may be rendered; that a reasonable fee may be allowed his attorneys and that he may have such other, further and full relief as
